Looking Ever Higher Pastor's Message

Open my mouth, and let me bear, Gladly the warm truth everywhere; Open my heart and let me prepare Love with Thy children thus to share.

"Open My Eyes, That I May See," #454 The United Methodist Hymnal, 1989

On May 29, 1953, Edmund Hillary and Tenzin Norgay made the first recorded ascent to the very top of Mount Everest. Following days of toil through the snow squalls and fighting for breath in the thin air, it must have then been an experience surreal and most extraordinary to be at the highest point on the planet.

I have been contemplating the idea that these two men would have made the climb with very different mindsets – one a Westerner, and the other from south Asia. How did Hillary see his ascent? The highest mountain in the world was named "Mount Everest" in 1865 after the Surveyor General of India, Sir George Everest, and for Hillary, as a New Zealander, it represented An immense physical challenge to be conquered. That this success coincided so nicely with the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II seemed perfect. Edmund Hillary was knighted in June 1953.

In contrast, Tenzin Norgay grew up in the shadow of the same mountain knowing it by its Tibetan name Chomolungma, meaning, "Holy Mother." This suggests a different relationship: not one of conquest, but of nurturing and love, respect and mutual dependence. No wonder the Sherpas are so dismayed to see the mother of all mountains now being treated as an extreme sport; its slopes covered with the litter of wealthy climbing parties.

The Hebrew scriptures put great stress on the significance of names. In Genesis, God gives Adam the powerful gift of naming the animals. Later, in Exodus, "I Am that I Am," is the King James Bible translation of the response God used when Moses asked for his name. These are among the most famous Torah verses. We have a natural tendency to assume that the name we use is the only name –



not to mention the right name – and as soon as we mentally label something good or bad, or friend or foe, we often blind ourselves to any other possibility. The more we can step out of our mental ruts, and be open to other points of view, the more there is to learn, discover, and enjoy.

Just a few years ago, I would never have guessed the world could be as it is now. The life I have now is not what was said on "the label" when I opened it! Unexpected turns in life cause stresses. There are tensions in our lives, our families, our congregation, our communities, our nation and world. Yet, today is a new opportunity to hear something anew – perhaps try a new name. The old Prayer for Illumination might be timely for us as we read the Bible and as we experience the world:

Lord, open our hearts and minds by the power of your Holy Spirit, that as the Scriptures are read and your Word is proclaimed, we may hear with joy what you say to us today. Amen.

Let's pray that each of us today can find an opportunity to look at something or somebody with fresh eyes, in a way that will bring more respect and understanding into the world.

I pray there will be a blessing in seeing anew for all of us,



May Worship Notes Busy May, with Ascension into the Bargain



This May seems to have nearly everything in the worship schedule! We begin with The Lord's Supper on May 5th, and then celebrate Ascension the next week on Mother's Day! The Sunday following is Pentecost – and we'll enjoy a picnic, followed by Trinity Sunday on Memorial Day weekend. These are some highly prominent occasions during May, but I'd like to make some comments regarding one, perhaps a little less well-known: Ascension.

The Ascension, celebrated 40 days after Easter, is one of the chief feasts of the Christian year. Depending on where you grew up and what congregation you belonged to, this holiday might ormight not mean much. It dates back at least to the later 4th century. Any old preacher worth her salt will tell you that the vital factor in the Ascension account is not Jesus departing into heaven (dramatic though that might seem), but Jesus' assurance that he will be with us always. Sorting out how to celebrate this spiritual truth is worth mulling over at least, and may be worth some serious struggle. Forty days following any Sunday will land you on a Thursday, but in our brand of Christianity we have shifted the celebration to the nearest convenient Sunday.

We don't really need a special day to understand

intellectually that Christianity teaches that Jesus ascended into heaven anymore than we need one to understand the Easter message or the meaning of the Declaration of Independence or that, given present social norms, not much workcan be accomplished on January 1st . Still, the faith is not only, or primarily an intellectual exercise – faith is a way of life. What we do and when we do it will influence who we are.


Gardening News by Barb O'Connell




Please Share Your Pictures with Us!

If you find pictures you'd like to share, please brings them to church and put them in the box on the table in the back of the sanctuary. Make sure they are




Simple Times of Prayer
